DESIGN FOR CHILD'S CARRIAGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,220, dated April 18, 1876; application filed March 29, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. MARBLE, of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have originated a Design for the Body of a Child's Carriage, of which the following is a description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustrations, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents a drop-front phaeton-body, whose back corners a are rounded on the outside. B is a quarter-panel under the back, bent to the curve of the back and inwardly inclined, as shown.

The dash C is more nearly vertical than heretofore.

I am aware that phaeton bodies have been built for children's use, and I do not claim them, the distinctive features of my design being the rounded back corners, the curved quarter-panel, and the dash C.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for the body of a child's carriage, consisting of the drop-front phaeton-body A, the curved quarter-panel B, the corners a, and the dash C, the several parts being of the form and ornamented substantially as represented.
