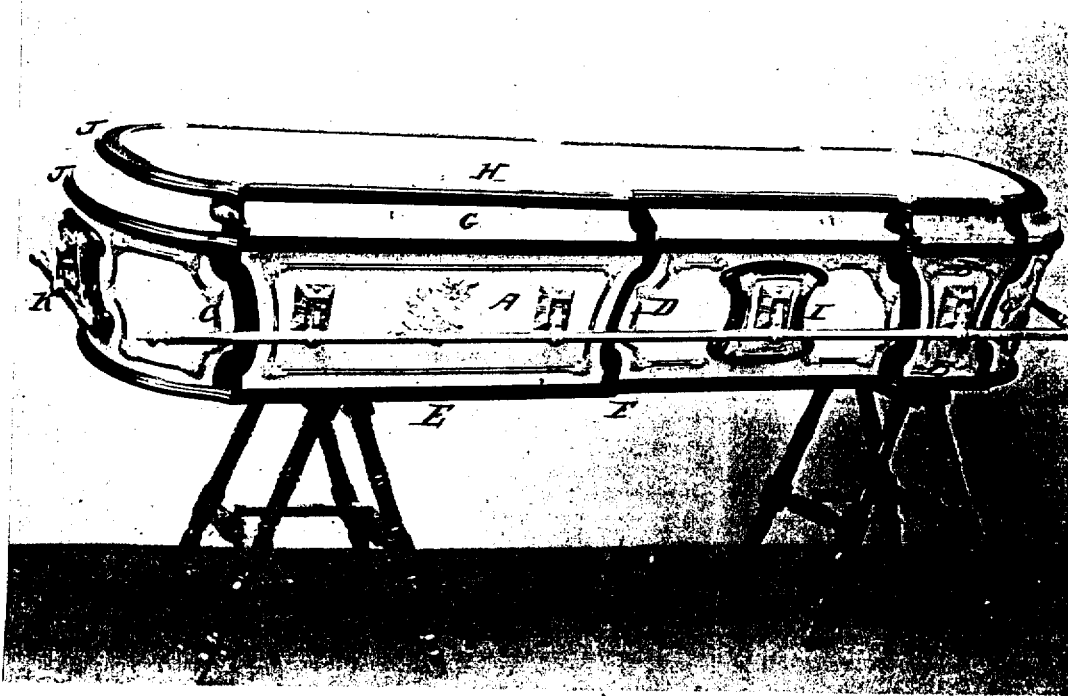

## DESIGN FOR BURIAL-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,221**, dated April 18, 1876; application filed March 21, 1876.

[Term of Patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOHN McGRATH, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Burial-Casket, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The upper sections A of the sides and the short sections B are made to extend or project outward farther than the end sections C and the lower side section D, the object being to break the sameness of the box-like forms of the common arrangement, in which the sides are uniform from end to end. The margins E and the vertical divisions F of the sections are molded and finished in ebony-black, also the end moldings J. Above the sides and ends is a concave section, G, which, like the sides, is made to project or extend laterally, correspondingly with the sections A and B, and it is covered with cloth, which is pasted in a rabbet in the surface. Above the section G is the cover H, which is trimmed

in the middle portion of the top with cloth. On the section D of the side is a shield, I, wrought in ebony-black moldings; all of the moldings have a rabbet for cloth. K represents end shields, similar to shield I.

I claim—

1. As a design for a burial-casket, the sections A B of the sides, extended or projected outwardly beyond the ends C and lower side section D, as set forth.
2. The concave section G, with outwardly-projecting sections, corresponding to the projecting side sections A B, as set forth.
3. The margins E, vertical divisions F, and the end moldings J, finished in ebony-black, as set forth.
4. The shield I on the side section D, wrought in ebony-black-finished moldings, as set forth.
5. The end shields K, as set forth.
