DESIGN FOR CARD-HOLDERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,225**, dated April 18, 1876; application filed March 31, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, LENTHEL S. DAVIS, of Waterbury, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a Design for a Card-Holder, of which the following is a specification :

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The main feature consists of an open or skeleton American shield, with a bell suspended within the opening. Below the shield,

and on each side of it, are leaves and grain. Above the shield are flags and an eagle. The shield, as above described, is mounted upon a base, B.

I claim as my invention—

A design for a card-holder, consisting of an open shield, with a bell suspended therein, substantially as described.
