

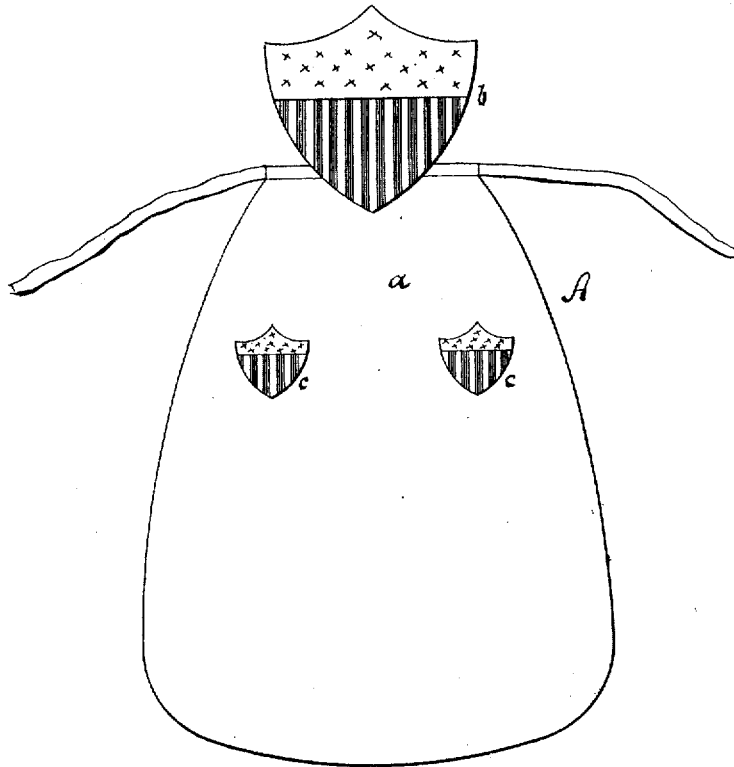

DESIGN FOR AN APRON.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,230**, dated April 18, 1876; application filed April 10, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLOTTE JENKINS, of the city of New York, county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Aprons, of which the following is a specification:

The drawing represents a front view of the new apron.

This invention has for its object to produce a new and original design for aprons; and consists in making the upper portion or flap of the apron, above the waist, in the form of a shield. The invention also consists in making the pockets of the apron in the form of shields, as hereinafter more fully described.

In the drawing, the letter *A* represents my new apron, of which *a* is the lower portion, and *b* the upper portion or flap. This upper portion *b* is made in the form of a shield, as

shown, and may be ornamented with the national or other colors, in suitable manner. *cc* are the pockets attached to the apron *A*. The outer sides of these pockets are also made in form of small shields, as shown, and may also be ornamented with suitable colors.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for an apron having the flap *b*, in form of a shield, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.

2. The design for an apron having the flap *b* and the pockets *cc*, in form of shield, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
