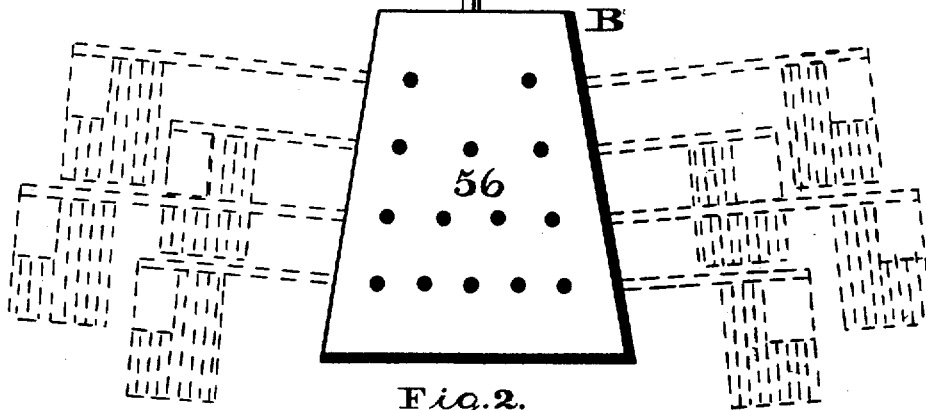
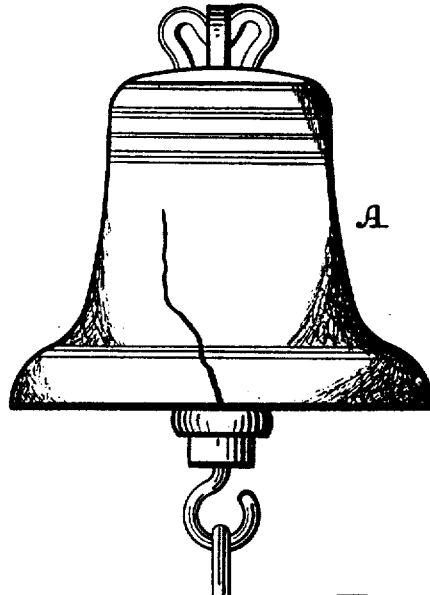
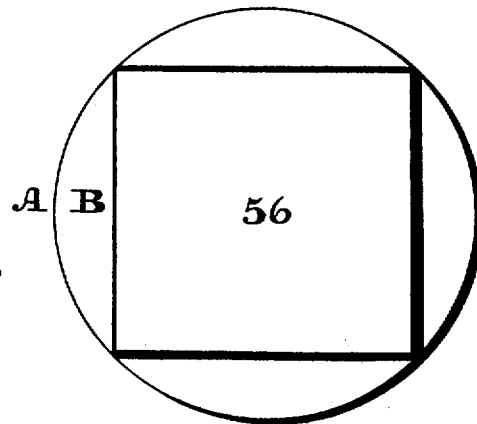

DESIGN FOR FLAG-HOLDERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,232**, dated April 18, 1876; application filed April 10, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, JOHN H. ODELL, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated a new and useful Design for Flag-Holders, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, in which—

A represents a bell, and B a weight beneath the same. The weight is the flag-holder proper, and is perforated at various points. On the sides of the weight may be the figures "56."

The weight is suggestive of the fifty-six signers of the Declaration of Independence, and the bell that of the "Liberty Bell" in Philadelphia, which was sounded when said declaration was announced.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a flag-holder, consisting of the bell A and weight B, as shown and described.
