DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,241, dated April 25, 1876; application filed March 25, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM G. HEANEY, of Camden, in the county of Camden- and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for a Badge, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

The invention relates to a design for a Centennial badge, being of oval shape, with a border inclosing a central part, on which the busts of Washington and Lincoln are ar-

In the illustration, A represents a badge, of oval or other shape, stamped of metal or other material, and finished in suitable manner.

A metal border, B, incloses a central part, C, in which the busts D of Washington and Lin-coln are arranged. The border is provided with inscriptions in suitable letters that indicate the character of the badge and its relation to the Centennial of the United States.

I claim as my invention-

The design for a badge composed of a border, inclosing the central part C, with the busts of Washington and Lincoln thereon, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
