

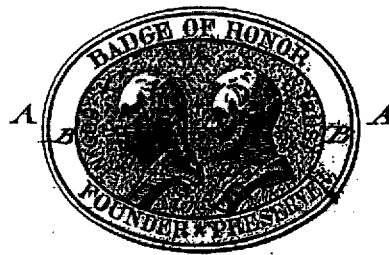

DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,241, dated April 25, 1876; application filed March 25, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM G. HEANEY, of Camden, in the county of Camden and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for a Badge, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The invention relates to a design for a Centennial badge, being of oval shape, with a border inclosing a central part, on which the busts of Washington and Lincoln are arranged.

In the illustration, A represents a badge, of oval or other shape, stamped of metal or other material, and finished in suitable manner.

A metal border, B, incloses a central part, C, in which the busts D of Washington and Lincoln are arranged. The border is provided with inscriptions in suitable letters that indicate the character of the badge and its relation to the Centennial of the United States.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a badge composed of a border, inclosing the central part C, with the busts of Washington and Lincoln thereon, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
