

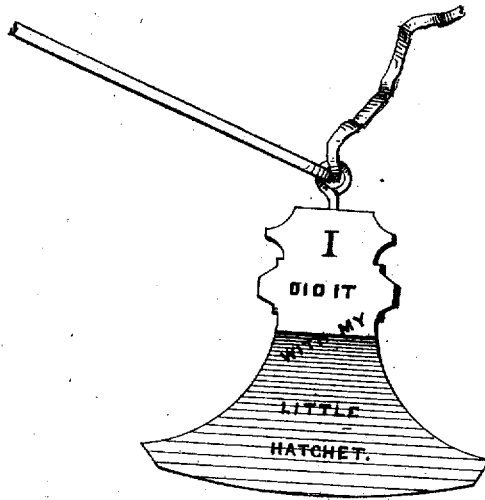

DESIGN FOR A WATCH-CHAIN CHARM.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,243**, dated April 25, 1876; application filed March 16, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, JAMES D. LYON, of Grand Rapids, Michigan, have originated and designed a Watch-Charm and similar articles of jewelry, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification.

The articles may be made of metal, wood, rubber, or other suitable material, in shape of a hatchet-blade, representing the one supposed to have been used by George Washington in cutting down the cherry-tree, with or without the inscription "I did it with my little hatchet," the peculiar shape of which is shown fully by the drawing.

I am aware that ornaments have been made

representing hatchets generally, but I am not aware that any hatchet of this peculiar shape, with or without the above inscription, has ever been used for such ornaments, and others than this I disclaim any desire to secure patented; but

What I do claim as new, and desire patented, is—

The design for a watch-chain charm in the form of a hatchet, and of the configuration described, and shown in the accompanying drawing, with or without the inscription "I did it with my little hatchet," as specified.
