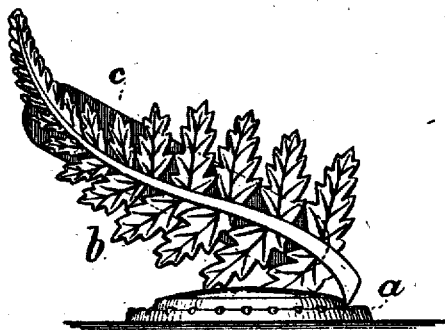
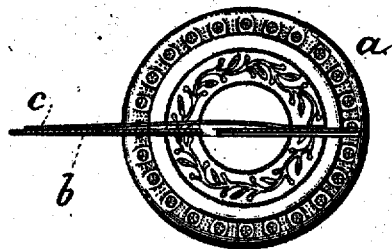

DESIGN FOR A BAS-RELIEF.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,248, dated April 25, 1876; application filed February 7, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. TUCKER, of Waterbury, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a Design for a Bas-Relief, of which the following is a specification:

The bas-relief design relates to a fern-leaf, and to a base for the same.

The fern-leaf *b* is represented in the elevation, Fig. 2, having the curved stem and leaflets, as shown. The base *a*, represented most clearly in Fig. 1, is a bas-relief of a circular and convex form, with the scroll and leaf work and knobs, as shown.

These bas-reliefs *a b* are preferably of sheet metal, pressed in dies, and they form ornaments that are adapted to holding photo-

graphs or other pictures, or to other uses, and the leaf may be used separate from the base. For a picture-holder, the springs *c* are added behind the bas-relief fern-leaf.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for a bas-relief, consisting of the fern-leaf, substantially as described, and shown in the drawing.

2. The design for a bas-relief base, *a*, with the ornamental leaflets and knobs, substantially as described, and shown in the drawing.
