

DESIGN FOR A TOY PIANO.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,250, dated April 25, 1876; application filed March 31, 1876.

To all whom it may concern: Be it known that I, FRANK VOIGT, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Toy Piano; of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The body a and lid b of the piano, or the

surfaces thereof, are pieces of nut shells, which are systematically arranged, and present the appearance of a solid body and lid of carved

The legs c are likewise pieces of nut-shells, work. arranged to present the appearance of carved work, with swells d at their upper ends, and narrowing, as at e.

The pedal f and pedal-support g are slices of nut-shells, and present the appearance of scrolls or open-work. The whole presents a unique and attractive design.

What I claim as my invention is-

1. The design for a toy piano, having a body, a, lid b, and legs c, composed of or representing nut-shells, as shown and described.

2. The design for a toy piano, having a pedal, f, and pedal-support g, formed, as shown, to present scrolls or open work, as described, and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
