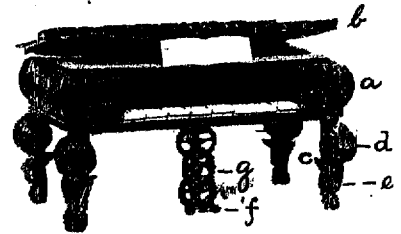

DESIGN FOR A TOY PIANO.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,250**, dated April 25, 1876; application filed March 31, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK VOIGT, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Toy Piano; of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The body *a* and lid *b* of the piano, or the surfaces thereof, are pieces of nut-shells, which are systematically arranged, and present the appearance of a solid body and lid of carved work.

The legs *c* are likewise pieces of nut-shells, arranged to present the appearance of carved work, with swells *d* at their upper ends, and narrowing, as at *e*.

The pedal *f* and pedal-support *g* are slices of nut-shells, and present the appearance of scrolls or open-work. The whole presents a unique and attractive design.

What I claim as my invention is—

1. The design for a toy piano, having a body *a*, lid *b*, and legs *c*, composed of or representing nut-shells, as shown and described.
2. The design for a toy piano, having a pedal, *f*, and pedal-support *g*, formed, as shown, to present scrolls or open-work, as described, and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
