

DESIGN FOR FLOWER-HOLDER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,258, dated May 2, 1876; application filed April 4, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AUGUSTUS WAYNE, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Flower-Holder, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration to which reference is made.

The invention relates to a design for a flow-er-holder, and consists of a vessel in the shape of a bell, with a groove in imitation of a crack, and top and bottom ribs.

A represents a flower-holder of any suitable material, that is made of the representation of a bell, a groove, α , in imitation of a crack, extending from the lower edge upward to the body or middle part of the bell-shaped hold-

er. Ribs b encircle the top and bottom parts of the holder, the top being open for the insertion of the flowers.

My whole is intended as an elegant souvenir

of the centennial year.

claim—
The design for a flower-holder, consisting of a representation of a bell, having a groove in imitation of a crack, and encircling top and bottom ribs, substantially as shown and de-
