

DESIGN FOR FLOWER-HOLDER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,259, dated May 2, 1876; application filed April 4, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John C. Wilson, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Flower-Holder, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The invention relates to a design for a flower-holder, and consists of a support made of three muskets interlocking at the bayonets, and of a vessel in the shape of a drum suspended therefrom.

In the illustration, A represents a stand or support made of three muskets that are inter-

locked-at the bayonets, to support a vessel, B, for holding the flowers, that is suspended by chains or cords therefrom. The vessel or holder B is made in the shape of a drum, as

Having thus described my invention, I claim-

A design for a flower-holder, consisting of a stand of interlocking muskets and of a vessel, being a representation of a drum, suspended therefrom, as shown and described.
