

DESIGN FOR A BAS-RELIEF.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,264, dated May 2, 1876; application filed April 18, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, James Madison Mon-ROE CONRAD, of Baltimore, Baltimore county, Maryland, have originated a Design for a Bas Relief, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description:

The figure in the accompanying drawing illustrates my "bas-relief" as applied to a

medal.

The main elements of the design are a central shield, an eagle surmounting the shield, and two male figures at opposite sides of the shield.

The figures may be represented, one in the uniform of the "Continental" army and the other in a modern dress.

If desired, the eagle may be omitted.

I claim-

1. The design for a bas-relief, composed of a shield and two male figures, attired, one in Continental costume and the other in modern dress, substantially as described, and shown

in the accompanying drawing.

2. The design for a bas-relief, consisting of two male figures in different costumes, a shield, and an eagle, as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
