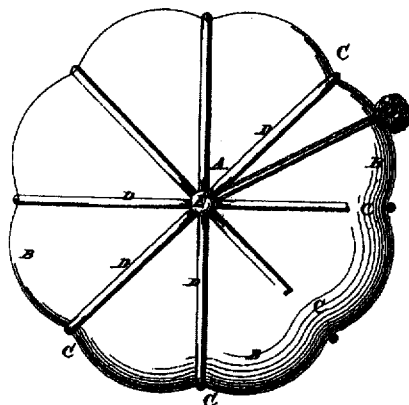
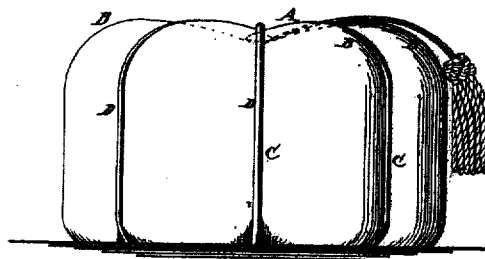

DESIGN FOR HASSOCKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,272, dated May 9, 1876; application filed March 13, 1876
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALEXANDER A. GANIARD, of Brooklyn, Kings county, New York, have invented a Design for a Hassock, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a top view of a hassock illustrating my improved design, part being broken away to show the form more clearly; and Fig. 2 is a side view of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawings, to which reference is made.

The sides of the hassock are vertical. The top of the hassock is made with a depression, A, in its center, and with its outer part B rounded off until it joins the sides. C are depressions passing up the sides and terminating at the central point of the top, and in

which are strips D of a different color from that of the covering of the hassock, to make a contrast. In the center of the top, where the grooves C and strips D meet, is a button, E, to give a finish to said top.

I claim as my invention—

A design for a hassock, in which the sides are vertical, the top has a depression in its center, and its outer part rounded off to meet the sides, having grooves running up its sides and over the top to its center, having in said grooves stripes of a different color from the color of the covering, and having an ornamental button in the center of its top, substantially as herein shown and described.
