DESIGN FOR A STATUE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,273**, dated May 9, 1876; application filed March 6, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY GEBHARD, of New York, in the State of New York, have originated and designed a Statue representing an athlete or gymnast, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

My design consists of the nude figure of a gymnast or athlete, exercising with the dumb-bells, and showing all the muscles of the body fully expanded or developed. With one leg advanced he poises aloft in his right hand a

dumb-bell, his gaze being fixed upon the same. The other dumb-bell lies on the ground between his feet.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a statue, consisting of the nude figure of a gymnast, with gaze fixed on a dumb-bell, which he poises aloft in his right hand, while the other dumb-bell lies on the ground at his feet, substantially as shown and described.
