

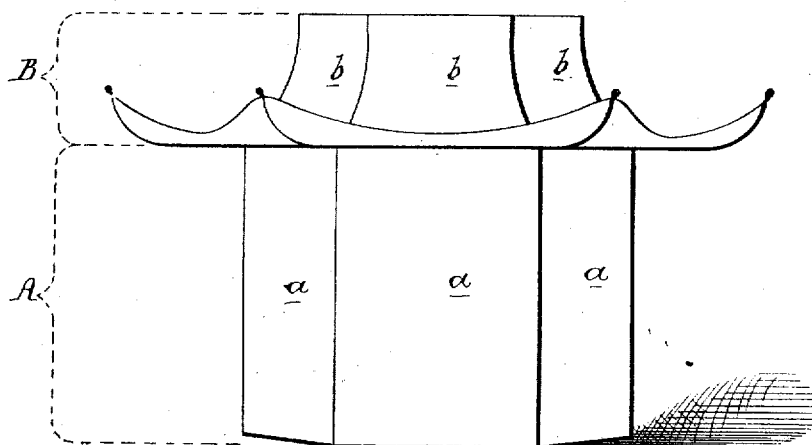

DESIGN FOR CANISTERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,275, dated May 9, 1876; application filed April 28, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH B. ROHRMAN, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Canister, of which the following is a specification:

My design is fully shown in the diagram in the accompanying drawing.

The body A of the canister, which may have any number of sides, *a*, is surmounted by a roof, B, which has the same number of sides, *b*, as the body, each of these sides being made concave and narrower at the top than at the lower edge, which latter projects beyond the body, so that the general effect is that of a pagoda-like structure.

The sides of the canister and of the roof

may be ornamented in many different ways, and one or more of the sides of the roof may be hinged so as to form a lid.

Without confining myself to any specific features of ornamentation, I claim—

The design for the pagoda-like canister, substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
