

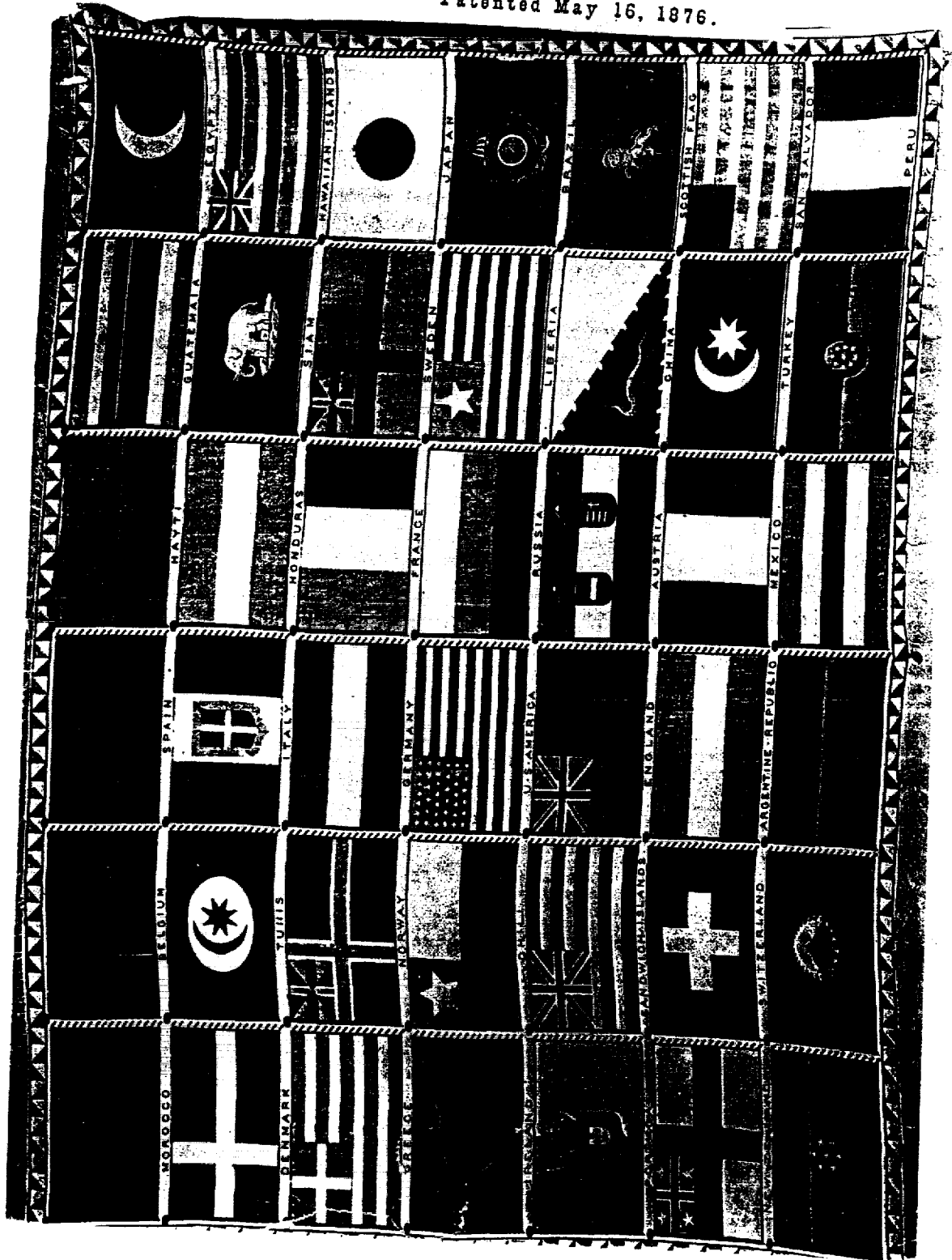

DESIGN FOR A FLAG.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,276, dated May 16, 1876; application filed March 27, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH B. ALTEMUS, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Flag, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a flag is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, and consists of a representation of the flags of different nations, arranged in seven horizontal rows, each row containing six flags.

The number and order of arrangement of the flags may, however, be varied without departing from the distinctive character of the design.

I claim—

The design for a flag, having on one surface the representation of the flags of different nations, arranged in unbroken rows and occupying spaces of uniform size, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
