DESIGN FOR A SHAWL OR BREAST PIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,290, dated May 16, 1876; application filed April 22, 1876. [Term of Patent 3; years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Thomas S. Drowne, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful Design for a Shawl or Breast Pin, of which the following is a specification:

This invention relates to a design for a pin

to be used a shawl or breast pin, &c.

This design is shown in the accompanying plate of drawings, Fig. 1 being a face view of a shawl-pin of my improved design, and Fig.

2 an edge view.

In the drawings, a a represent two hatchetblades, and b the handle to each blade. The handles b cross each other midway of their length, which brings the blades at opposite ends of the device. (See Fig. 1 more particularly.) c, a pin by which to use the combined design of hatchet blades and handles above described, the whole being made of suitable metal or other material.

If desired, the blades a and handles b may be ornamented by engraving or otherwise, and obviously my improved design is applicable to other and many articles of ornament worn by persons, as, for instance, to sleeve-buttons, studs, bosompins, &c.

Having now described my design, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent,

The design for a shawl or breast pin composed of the hatchets a and pin e, arranged substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawings.
