

DESIGN FOR A SMOKING-PIPE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,291, dated May 16, 1876; application filed April 4, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN K. NEAL, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Pipe-Bowl, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration,

to which reference is made.

My invention relates to a design for a pipebowl made in the shape of an inverted bell, with crack, ribs, crown part, and cover, with handle in shape of the tongue.

In the illustration, A represents a pipe-bowl made of the representation of a bell, placed in inverted position on any suitable stem. The crown part B, at the lowermost part, forms the connection with the stem, while the body of the bell is made with a groove, a, in imitation

of a crack, the groove extending from the upper smooth or ragged edge down to about the middle of the bowl. The bowl has encircling ribs b near the upper and lower part, as shown. The cover is seated within the enlarged part of the bell, and has a handle, C, in the shape of a tongue or clapper, that surmounts the bowl.

The design is intended as a souvenir of the centennial year.

Having thus described my invention, I claim—

The design herein shown and described.
