

DESIGN FOR HARNESS ORNAMENTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,292, dated May 16, 1876; application filed April 11, 1876.

[Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Wm. S. Robbins, of New Bedford, in the county of Bristol and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for an Ornament for Harnesses of Horses, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

A represents a glass ornament, cut in facets and hung between the arms of the frame B in such manner that it may swing freely, which frame may be affixed to the harness of a horse in the usual manner.

I am aware that swinging ornaments are

ments are used for other purposes, and I do not claim them. The distinctive character of my design is in the application of cut-glass brilliants for ornamenting harnesses.

I claim as my invention—

The design for harness ornaments, consisting of the bell-shape frame B, provided with a glass pendant, A, cut with facets, substantially as shown and described.
