DESIGN FOR PUMP-CURB.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,294, dated May 16, 1876; application filed April 26, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY L. FRY, of Oakley, in the county of Hamilton, State of Ohio, have originated and designed a Pattern for Well or Pump Curbs, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration or drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the panel or side of a curb, ornamented with a representation of a fountain in relief. The fountain shown is modeled after the Cincinnati fountain. C and D represent an ornamented heading or cap for a curb. This heading or cap may be ornamented by the shell-shaped center D and by the border C, representing dolphins or figures similar thereto, as shown in the accompanying illustration. B represents an ornamented base, upon which may be placed the figures

1876, as referring to the Centennial year of the Republic. E and E represent the front and back of a curb, which may be ornamented with any figures that may be selected.

What I claim for my invention is—

1. A design for a panel of a well or pump curb, A, consisting of the representation in relief of a fountain, substantially as shown.
2. A design for the upper border C of a well or pump curb, consisting of the dolphins, arranged substantially as shown.
3. A design for the top of a well or pump curb, consisting of the shell D and border C, substantially as shown.
4. A design for the base of a well or pump curb, consisting of the dragons, arranged substantially as shown, with the figures 1876 between them.
