

DESIGN FOR ORNAMENTAL SKIRT-BORDERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,301, dated May 23, 1876; application filed April 11, 1876. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ISIDOR HAUSER, of city and State of New York, have invented an original Design for Ornamental Skirt-Borders, of which the following is a specification:

This design, imprinted or otherwise formed on the borders of skirts, consists of panels containing, alternately, a shield, with the figures "1776" thereon, and a scroll or other ornamental center-piece, with the letters "G. W.," as illustrated in the accompanying drawing. The top and bottom of the panels may be ornamented as shown, with the word "Centennial" around the bottom of each panel.

Various colors may be used in the design, this being a matter of taste.

I claim-

The design for ornamental skirt-borders, as shown and described.
