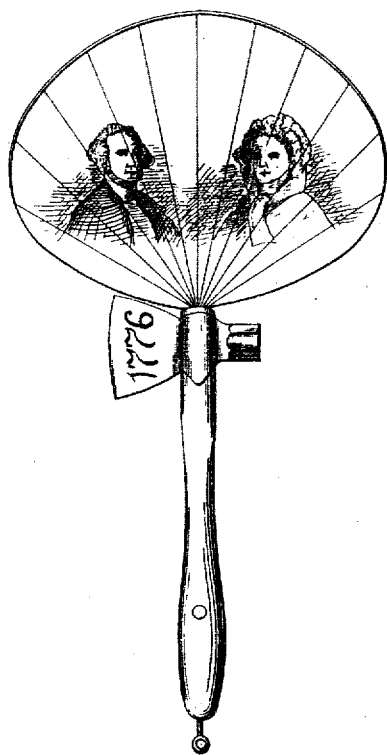
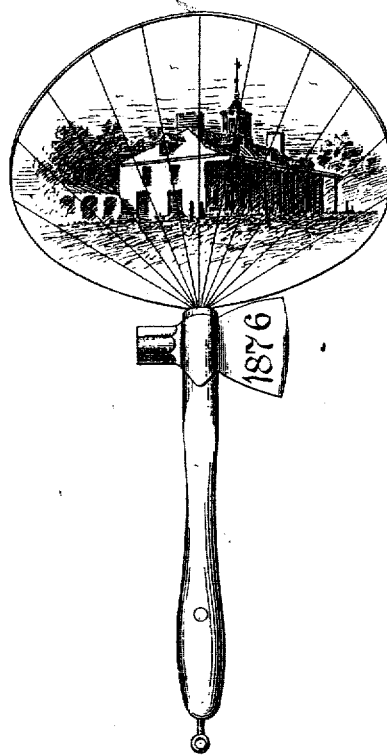

DESIGN FOR A FAN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,310**, dated May 23, 1876; application filed May 5, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that we, MARY F. FOSTER and ANNA W. THOMAS, residing in the city of Washington, District of Columbia, have originated and Designed a Fan, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of our design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made. It consists of the portraits of George Washington and Martha Washington on one side of a folding fan. Also, a representation of the house at Mount Vernon on the reverse. Also, in giving the handle or case the configuration of a hatchet, as represented. The figures 1776 may be placed on one side of the hatchet and 1876 on the other.

What we claim as our invention is—

1. The design for folding fan, having on one side the portraits of George Washington and Martha Washington, substantially as shown.

2. The design for a folding fan having on the reverse side a representation of the house at Mount Vernon, substantially as shown.

3. The design for the handle or case of a folding fan, consisting of the configuration of a hatchet, substantially as shown.
