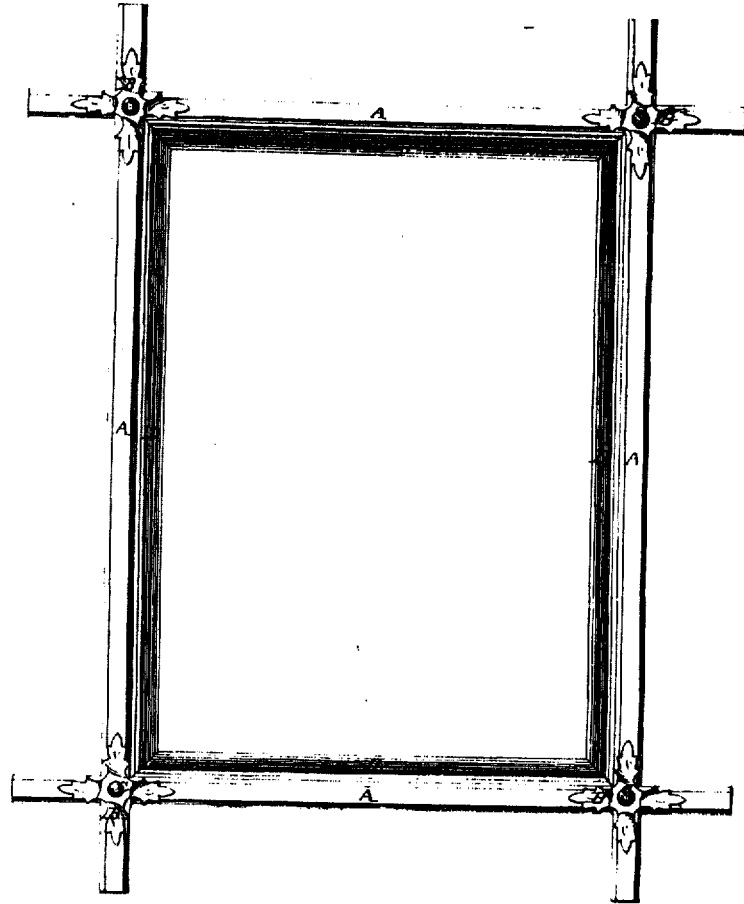

DESIGN FOR A PICTURE-FRAME.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,316**, dated May 30, 1876; application filed April 24, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY J. BROWN, of Troy, in the county of Cheshire and State of New Hampshire, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Picture-Frames; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification.

The nature of my design for picture-frames is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawings.

A A represent the wooden bars forming the frame, which bars are mortised or halved into each other, and the ends projecting beyond the sides of the frame for a suitable distance. The front faces of the bars A are flat and the edges beveled, and at the joint is fastened a

four-armed leaf, or an ornament, B, of four leaves, resting upon the bars, as shown. In the center of the ornament B is a round or semi-spherical knob, C. To the inner edges of the bars A are fastened gilt moldings D, having their corners mitered, as shown.

What I claim is—

The design for a picture-frame, consisting of the flat-surfaced bars A, having beveled edges and projecting beyond the corners of the frame, the four-leaved ornament B, with center knob C, and the gilt molding D, all substantially as shown and described.
