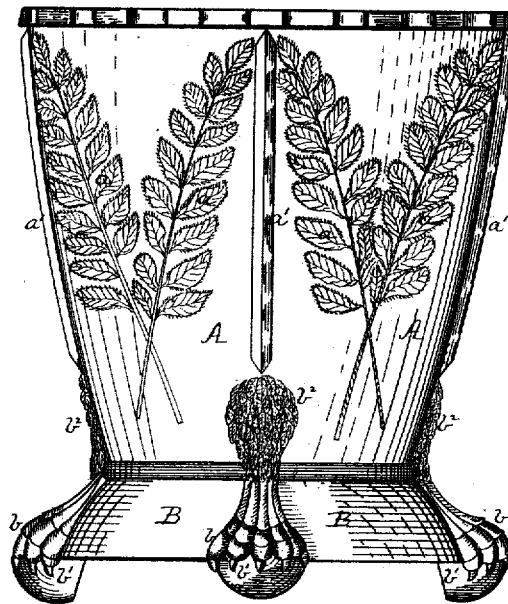

## DESIGN FOR GLASSWARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,324**, dated June 6, 1876; application filed May 26, 1876.

[Term of Patent  $3\frac{1}{4}$  years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, THOMAS B. ATTERBURY, of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Design for the Manufacture of Glassware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, illustrating my invention.

My design is intended for the ornamentation of glassware; and consists in producing in or on an article the representation of a fern, and also, when the article is a footed article, forming upon the foot the representation of a bird's leg and claw, the feathered portion of the claw having a unity of design with the fern which ornaments the body or bowl of the article.

In the drawing, A indicates a bowl, provided with a foot, B, the bowl having formed thereon in relief a series of ferns, *a a*, which may be separated by prisms *a'*. Extended from the bowl A over the foot B are a series of bird-

claws, *b*, clasping the balls *b'*. That portion of the leg or claw above the foot, and which is formed upon bowl A, is feathered, as at *b''*, to correspond in design with the ferns *a*.

I do not design to limit my design to a fern of the character shown, as the same æsthetic effect may be produced by a fern of a different class, or even by a proper arrangement of feathers.

What I claim, and desire to secure as a design for glassware, is—

1. The fern-pattern, substantially as shown and described.

2. In combination with the fern-pattern upon the bowl, the bird-claw foot, substantially as shown and described.
