DESIGN FOR PAPER-WEIGHTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,326, dated June 6, 1876; application filed May 10, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK A. FOUTS, of Bloomington, in the county of McLean, and in the State of Illinois, have invented a certain new and original Design for Paper Weights; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

My invention is a design for paper weight, and is fully illustrated in the accompanying

drawing.

A is a representation of the old Independ-

ence Bell, with a crown, B, on top, and surmounted with an eagle, C. This is intended as a paper-weight.

What I claim is-

The design for paper-weight, consisting of the bell A, crown B, and eagle C, as shown and described.
