

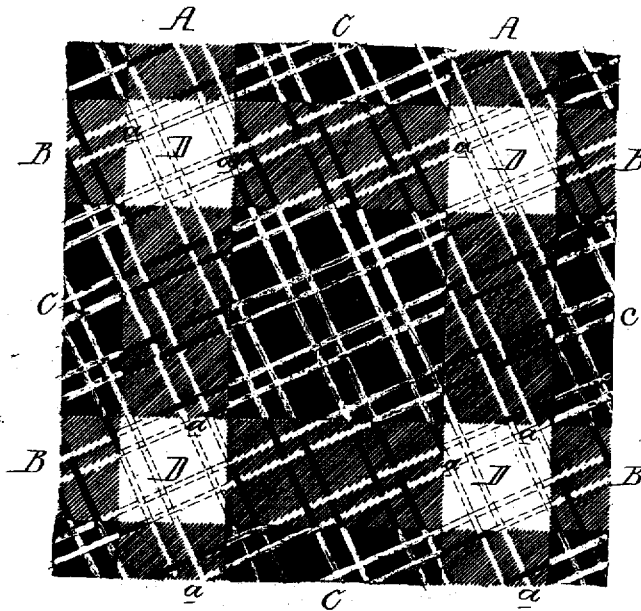

DESIGN FOR SHAWL FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,327**, dated June 6, 1876; application filed February 28, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, CHARLES H. LANDENBERGER, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Shawl Fabric, of which the following is a specification :

My design for a shawl fabric is fully shown in the accompanying drawing.

C is the body of the fabric, which is crossed by vertical stripes A and horizontal stripes B, the former running parallel with the sides, and the latter parallel with the ends of the shawl.

The entire face of the shawl is crossed by stripes *a* and *b*, running diagonally in respect to the sides and ends.

Where the stripes A and B cross each other

spots D, of a color differing from both body and stripes, are formed.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—

The design for a shawl fabric, comprising the diagonal stripes *a* and *b*, and stripes A and B parallel with the edges, as shown and described.
