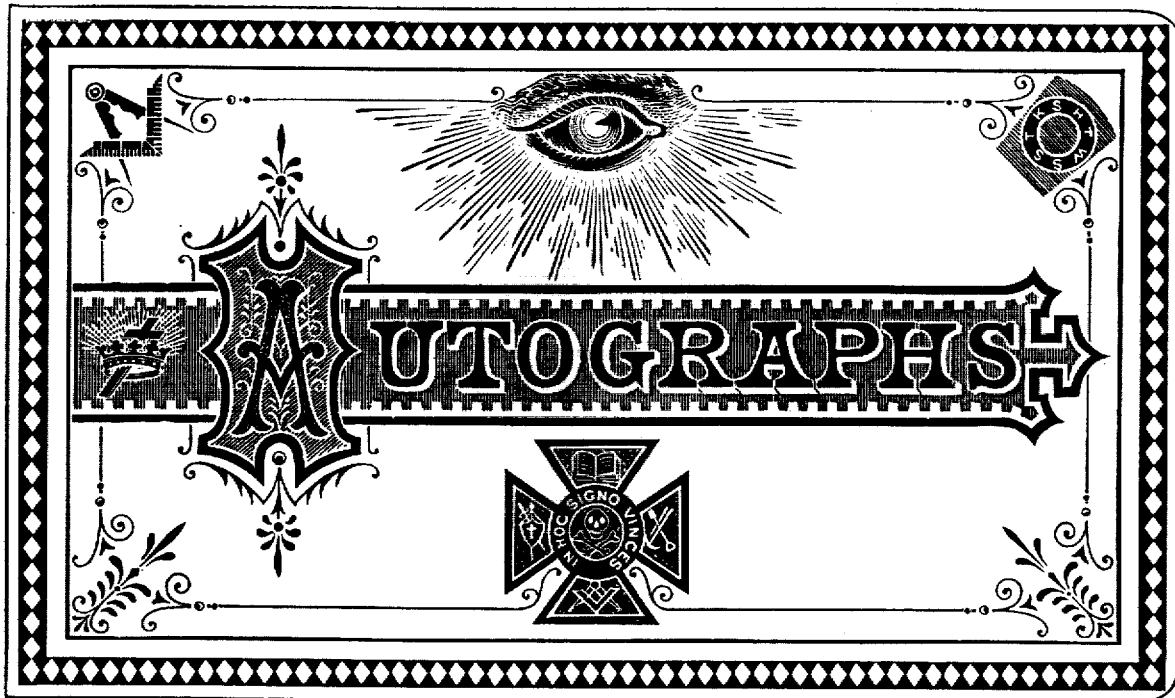

DESIGN FOR COVERS OF ALBUMS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,332**, dated June 6, 1876; application filed May 20, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH LIEBENROTH, of College Point, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design to be Impressed upon the Covers of Albums; and the following is declared to be a description of the same.

My design consists of a rectangular border made up of small diamond-shaped figures. Inside of this border are masonic emblems—the square and compass at the upper left-hand corner, the keystone at the upper right-hand corner, and at the middle part, within the border, is the eye; at the middle, within the lower border, is represented the Maltese cross.

The central space inside the border contains the word "autographs," in an ornamental tablet, with a cross and crown before the illuminated A.

The annexed print shows the said design.

The design aforesaid is to be impressed into the covers of autograph and other albums, in the usual manner of ornamenting books, and gold-leaf is generally used with such impression; but the color forms no part of my said design.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design of the impression to be printed upon the covers of albums, consisting of masonic emblems and ornamental border, arranged substantially as above described.
2. The design of the impression to be printed upon the covers of books, consisting of the ornamental tablet, containing the illuminated word autograph, as represented.
