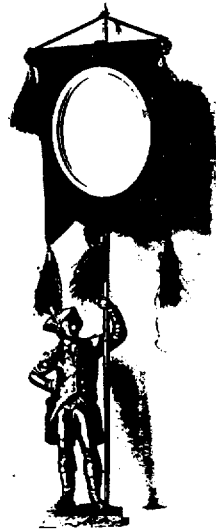

DESIGN FOR A STATUE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,337**, dated June 13, 1876; application filed May 15, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM L. ELTING, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented or produced a Design for a Statue, of which the following is a specification:

The said design is represented in the accompanying photograph.

The figure is that of a male dressed in Continental uniform, with high top boots, cross-belts, epaulets, and three-sided hat, and the left arm is elevated to hold a standard. The figure stands upon a polygonal base. The

standard is adapted to hold a flag, a hanging photograph-holder, or other article.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a statue, consisting of the figure of a male dressed in Continental uniform, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
