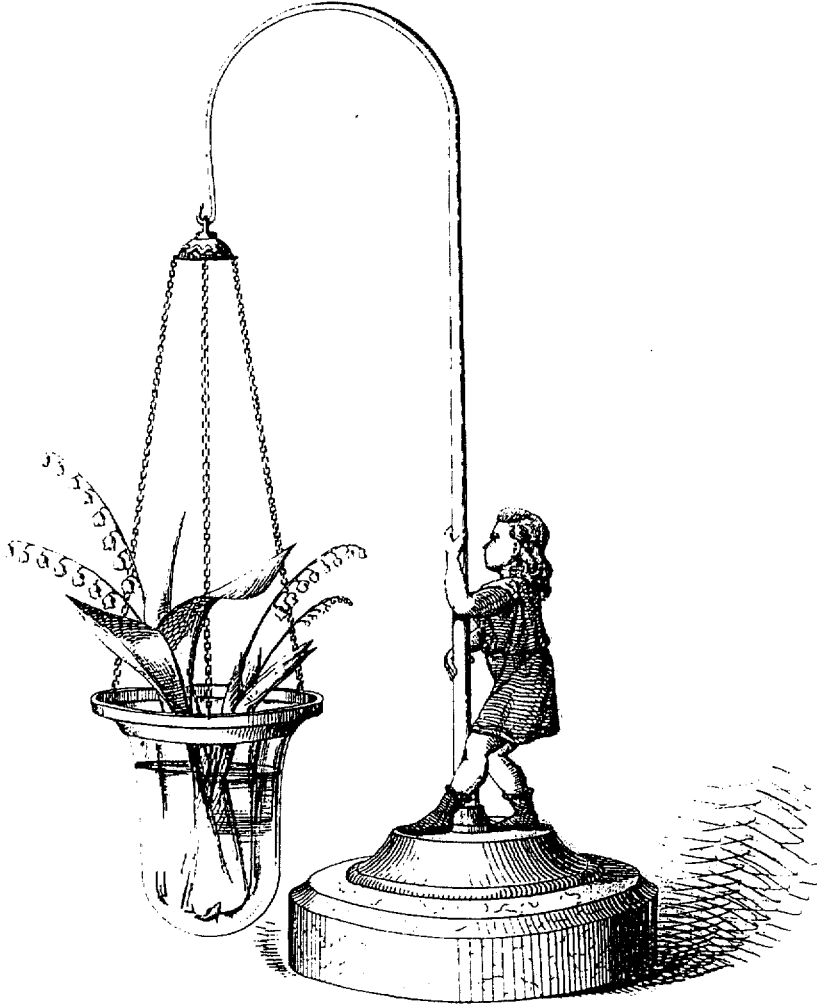

## DESIGN FOR FLOWER-STANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,356, dated June 27, 1876; application filed May 22, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOSEPH KINTZ, of West Meriden, New Haven county, Connecticut, have invented a Design for a Flower-Stand, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, the same being the figure of a child standing on a pedestal, and holding a rod from the upper end of which a flower vase or cup is suspended.

I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

As a design for a flower-stand, the representation of a child holding a rod from which a flower cup or vase is suspended, as shown and set forth.
