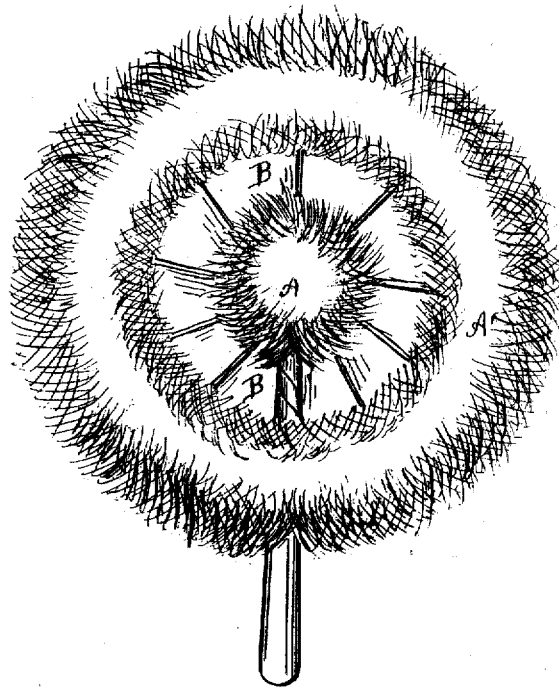

DESIGN FOR A FAN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,360**, dated June 27, 1876; application filed April 17, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, BESSIE WALKER, of Niagara Falls, in the county of Niagara and State of New York, have originated and designed a new style of Ladies' Fan, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

This invention consists in a design for a fan composed of silk and feathers, arranged substantially as hereinafter described.

A represents the inner or central part of the fan, and composed of feathers, preferably of that kind called "marabout," and A' represents the outer edge of the fan, covered with a similar feather or feathers, or down.

The central part of the fan B is of silk, and comprises the main body of the fan proper. The feather part is to aid in ornamenting it. The fan will be of two or more colors. The

silk part will be plaited or "shirred," and of red, white, blue, pink, or other color or colors, and the feather part usually of another or contrasting color.

The shape of the fan is not material, as it may be round, oval, square, octagonal, or other form desired, and the handle will be of ivory, bone, or wood, plain or ornamented.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a fan, composed of the body B and feather ornaments A and A', substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
