## DESIGN FOR CENTER-PIECE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,368, dated July 4, 1876; application filed March 13, 1876. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL KELLETT, of the city and county of San Francisco, State of California, have invented a new and original Design for a Center-Piece, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, and to the letters marked thereou.

My design is composed of wreaths of flowers as leading figures of inner portion of centerpiece. Said wreaths start from rosette, flowing downward toward drop of center-piece. These rosettes are part of subordinate design, made to receive said wreaths, and resting

upon a plain disk. The above is inclosed by a plain bead-molding. The middle or second division of design

is composed of stems, leaves, and scrolls, touching dividing panel figure. Round beads are placed between last-described forms and

inner plain bead-molding. On outer moldings are placed stems bound with tendrils and surmounted with leaves. At equal distance between leaves a scroll form with leaves on outer points covers moldings.

The letter A designates wreaths of flowers; B, rosette; C C, subordinate design, semiground work, curving upward on approaching plain bead; D E F, stems, leaves, and scrolls; G, stems bound with tendrils; H, clusters of leaves; I, scrolled forms overlying outer mold-

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The design for center-piece, as shown. SAML. KELLETT.
