DESIGN FOR TEXTILE FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,382, dated July 4, 1876; application filed March 31, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years,]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Michna, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern or Ornamental Design for Textile Fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The drawing represents a face view of my

design.

This design consists in the representation of a structure composed of a main building, presenting a long, uniform front, and annexes at each end, said annexes being composed of square towers, which rise above the rest of the structure, and on the tops of which are raised numerous flags.

In the drawing, the letter A designates a

structure which is composed of a main building, a, presenting a long, uniform front, and provided with a series of doors and windows. On the ends of this main building are annexes b c, with square towers c, which rise above the rest of the building, and on which are raised numerous flags, f.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is-

The design for textile fabrics, composed of a main building, a, and annexes b c, having square towers e and numerous flags, f, all as shown and described.
