


DESIGN FOR SCARF-BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,384, dated July 11, 1876; application filed April 17, 1876 [Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JACOB H. FLEISCH, of the city of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated a Design for Top of a Scarf-Box, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A is the body of the box intended to contain scarfs, &c. B is the cover of the same. Upon the upper surface of the cover is represented a vest of the prevailing style, shape, and pattern, with a locket and chain depending from the pocket and button hole. The top

of the box within the inner outline of the collar and breast of the vest is cut away to add to the effect of the representation.

This imitation of a vest may be designed in any style, and printed in any color suitable to its natural appearance.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for the top of a box, for putting up men's scarfs, which top or cover is made substantially in the manner above described.
