DESIGN FOR A COMBINED CALENDAR AND CARD-RECEPTACLE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,387**, dated July 11, 1876; application filed May 13, 1876.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DARIUS C. NEWELL, of Yonkers, in the county of Westchester and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Combined Calendar and Card-Holder, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of the said design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made. It consists of a series of monthly calendars, mounted on a decorated slip, with which is combined an open receptacle, with a curved front and sloping bottom. The calendar and the receptacle are marked, respectively, with numerals and with the word "Cards."

I do not claim a calendar composed of shield-shaped slips; nor do I claim by itself the conformation of the bottom of the receptacle in the manner shown.

What I claim as my invention is—

The improved design for a calendar-card, consisting of the base, the central shield-shaped calendar, and the receptacle, having the configuration shown, combined and ornamented as shown and described.
