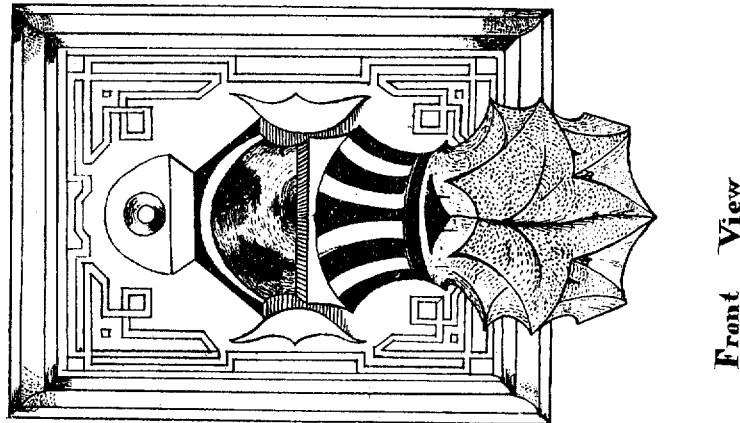
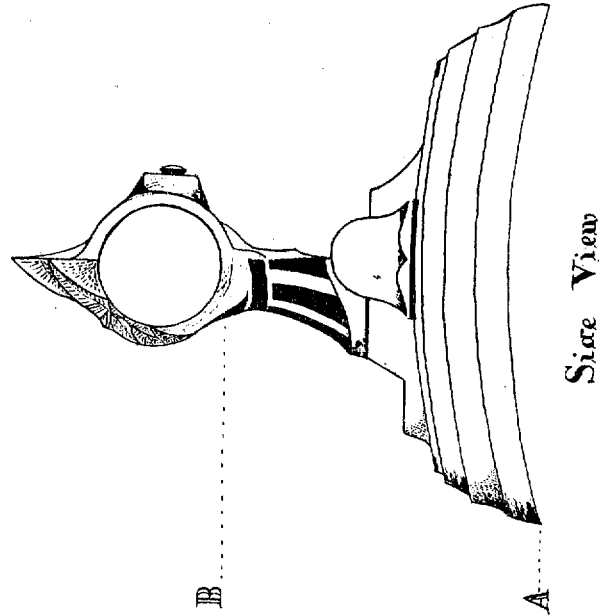

DESIGN FOR CASKET-HANDLE LUGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,393**, dated July 11, 1876; application filed June 19, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, W. MAX REID, of Amsterdam, in the county of Montgomery and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Lug for a Burial-Casket Handle, of which the following is a specification :

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawings, to which reference is made.

B represents the arm or lever, and A the ear, which, united, form the lug. The end of the arm or lever is ornamented with leaves, overlying each other, having alternate burnished and plain lines or bands running lengthwise from the leaves to the point where it is united with the ear, and having a burnished band running around the center of the arm or

lever, substantially as shown in the accompanying drawing.

The ear is square, having the raised edges ornamented with alternate burnished and plain bands, and the top or plane surface ornamented with burnished lines, substantially as shown in the accompanying drawing.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a burial-casket-handle lug, composed of an arm or lever and ear, as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
