DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,394, dated July 18, 1876; application filed May 22, 1876. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES M. CONNER, of Greenville, Hudson county, New Jersey, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made; and consists of a letter the up and down strokes of which are of uneven thickness, some of which are curved, and others of which are angled at the top and bottom, as shown.

The shade-line drops angularly from the right and bottom of the letter.

In the letters B, D, P, and R, the upper portion of the letter is partially curved, and projects over and beyond the top of the up and down line of the letter.

When the same can be employed, as in the case of the letters D, F, H, and others, a flourish is added to the letter, and projects about centrally from the left of the up and down line of the letter.

In the lower-case the angular and curved terminations of the up and down lines are used, and the shade is at the right and bottom of the same.

Having now described my design, what I claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-types, as described and shown.
