

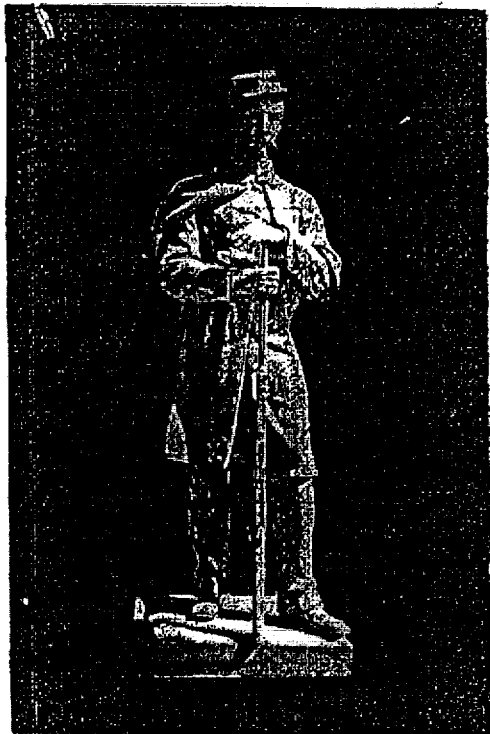

DESIGN FOR A STATUE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,396**, dated July 18, 1876; application filed June 8, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, J. W. FISKE, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Statue, of which the following is a specification:

This design represents a soldier dressed with an overcoat having a cape, one edge of which is turned back over the right arm, and with a military cap on his head. The figure is poised or rests on the right foot, with the left foot advanced; and the right hand grasps the barrel of a gun, the butt of which rests on the ground or pedestal on which the figure stands, while the left hand rests upon the muzzle of the gun, the figure being that of a soldier at rest.

This figure is to be cast of metal, and is intended to be of life size, or nearly so, thus furnishing an ornamental figure or statue for military monuments, grounds, buildings, and similar places.

What I claim is—

The herein-described design, consisting of the figure or statue of a soldier at rest, with one hand grasping, and the other hand resting on, a gun, as shown and described.
