DESIGN FOR AN EMBROIDERY-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,404**, dated July 13, 1876; application filed July 3, 1876
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board, the object being to indicate on the surface the pattern to be wrought.

The motto which constitutes the principal element of this design is "Onward and Upward," with an emblem consisting of a bou-

quet of flowers centrally arranged. The peculiar form of letters and the bouquet constitute the peculiar features of this design. It will be understood that the bouquet may be somewhat varied without departing from the general features of this design, it only being essential that a bouquet of flowers be present.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of the motto "Onward and Upward," with a bouquet of flowers as the emblem, in form as shown in the accompanying illustration.
