

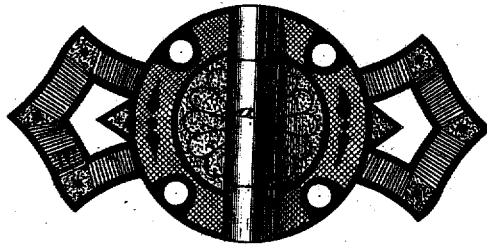

DESIGN FOR HINGES FOR BURIAL-CASKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,406**, dated July 25, 1876; application filed July 10, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUSSELL H. BURR, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Casket-Hinge; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for hinges for casket-covers; and the invention consists in the peculiar configuration of the hinge, or representation of a hinge, as shown in the accompanying illustration, and hereinafter described.

The center is of circular form, and from op-

posite sides projects a fan-shaped ornament, and transversely across the center a bead, *a*, is formed, representing the knuckle of the hinge, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The ornamentation of the surface is immaterial, the special feature of this design being the peculiar outline. In some cases this may be a hinge, and in others only a representation.

I claim—

The design for casket-hinge, consisting of the circular center with fan-shaped ornaments and transverse bead, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
