

DESIGN FOR TRIMMING.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,410, dated July 25, 1876; application filed June 8, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Ludwig Sutro, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed an Ornamental Trimming, of which the following is a clear and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

A represents an ornament, composed of a hollow mold, of any material, formed in the shape of a bell, and covered with threads of silk, worsted, linen, cotton, or other material. A pendant, B, is fastened inside the bell-shaped ornament, and represents the hammer of a bell. The whole is attached to a cord, C, of any material, and representing the hanger of a bell. D represents an ornament formed in the shape of a steeple or tower, and composed of woven or knitted threads of silk, worsted, linen, cotton, or other material.

The bell-shaped ornament A may be hung

inside the tower-shaped ornament D, and, being a representation of the Old Liberty Bell, the whole forms a beautiful ornament appropriate to the centennial year of the independence of the United States of America.

To the bottom of the trimming may be attached a skirt of bullion-cords, or threads and tapes formed into bunches, E, and to the top may be fastened a cord and knot, F, the whole combination then forming a strong and beautiful tassel.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a trimming, consisting of an ornament in the shape of a bell hung within an ornament in the shape of a steeple or tower, with an attachment of a skirt of bullion cords or threads and tapes formed into bunches, substantially as above described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
