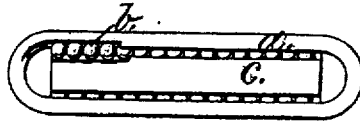

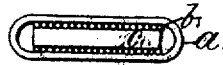

## DESIGN FOR ORNAMENTAL CHAIN-LINKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,416**, dated August 1, 1876; application filed April 24, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, OSCAR M. DRAPER, of North Attleborough, in the county of Bristol, State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for a Chain-Link for Watch and other Chains, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawings, to which reference is made.

Figure 1 is an enlarged view, partly in section, of my newly-designed chain-link. Fig. 2 is a view of my chain-link arranged with a beaded wire between the link proper and the center. Fig. 3 is a view of my chain-link arranged with a fluted center.

The design consists in an oblong chain-link, *a*, provided with rounded ends, the central portion being filled with a panel, *c*, separated from the link by a line of beads, *b*.

The panel may be engraved or enameled; but I prefer to give to the same a fluted section, as is shown in Fig. 3.

The border is formed of the raised link *a*, and the block or panel extends to, or nearly to, the rounded end of the link.

The line of bead-work which separates the link from the panel is made of beaded wire, and forms an agreeable relief with a plain or engraved panel.

When the fluted panel shown in Fig. 3 is used, a twisted wire may be used with good effect.

I claim—

The design for an ornamental chain-link, composed of the panel *c*, surrounded by the link *d* and intermediate beaded or twisted wire *b*, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
