

DESIGN FOR COFFIN ORNAMENTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,422, dated August 1, 1876; application filed July 24, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUSSELL H. BURR, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Casket Ornament; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for ornament for caskets; and it consists in the peculiar configuration of the ornament, as more fully hereinafter described, and as represented in the accompanying illustration.

On a horizontal bar two doves rest, facing each other, with upturned bills supporting a

crown. Beneath the crown, between the doves, is a cross. Drooping from the bar is a fan-shaped drapery in the center, with a representation of a tassel at each side, together with a cornucopia, the mouth of which is represented as filled with kernels of wheat, all as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim-

The design for casket ornament, consisting of a pair of doves resting upon a bar, supporting a crown, and with drapery from the bar, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
