DESIGN FOR COFFIN ORNAMENTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,423**, dated August 1, 1876; application filed July 24, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUSSELL H. BURR, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Casket Ornament; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for casket ornaments, or may be a substitute for name-plate; and it consists in the peculiar configuration, as hereinafter described.

The center or ground is of circular form, over and drooping to each side of which is the representation of a ribbon, on which are the words "Our Darling Babe." This ribbon

rests upon a base corresponding to its form, surmounted with a tip, and also with a foot-piece or projection at the bottom, as shown in the accompanying illustration. On the circular center there is the representation of a vase of flowers; but this may be dispensed with, and the center used as a name-plate.

I claim—

The design for casket ornament, consisting of the circular center, with a representation of a ribbon above and drooping to each side, on a ground of corresponding form, surmounted with a tip, and with a foot-piece or projection, all as shown in the accompanying illustration.
