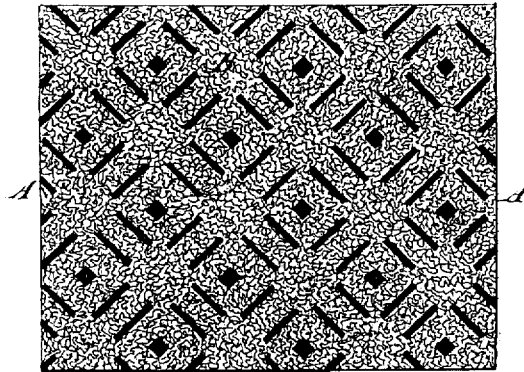
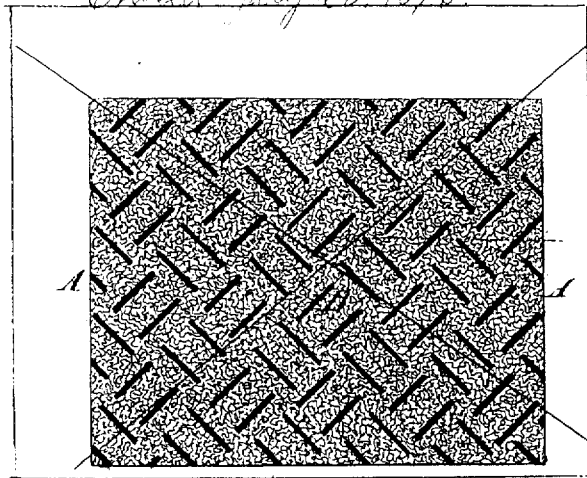

DESIGN FOR WATER-PROOF FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,425**, dated August 1, 1876; application filed July 1, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DAVID L. EINSTEIN, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for Water-Proof Fabrics, of which the following is a specification:

The design is fully illustrated in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the body of my water-proof fabric, the nap of which is raised to exhibit a figure, consisting of a central dot, about which are arranged four straight lines,

in parallel pairs, but not prolonged so as to touch each other, the several figures being placed in oblique rows, with suitable intervals between them.

What I claim as new is—

The design for water-proof fabrics, substantially as shown and described.
