



DESIGN FOR ASH-BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,435, dated August 8, 1876; application filed July 3, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANDREW SCHMITT, of Williamsburg, Kings county, State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern and Form of Boxes used for Ashes, Garbage, &c., of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which ref-

erence is made.

Figure I is a side view of my improved ashbox. Fig. II is a top view of the same.

A represents the body or material of which the boxes are made. They are made square

with rounded off corners, and the strips of metal B B are put around the boxes at the top and bottom and in the center. Other strips C C are fastened to the sides vertically, crossing the strips B B.

I do not confine myself to the number of the strips B B and C C, as increased sizes of boxes will require increased number of strips.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a square ash-box, with roundedoff corners, and provided with strips BB and CC, substantially as described.
