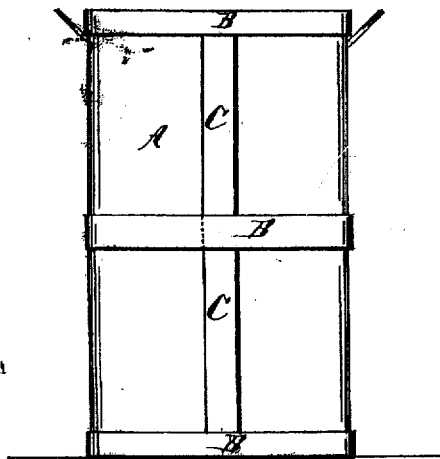
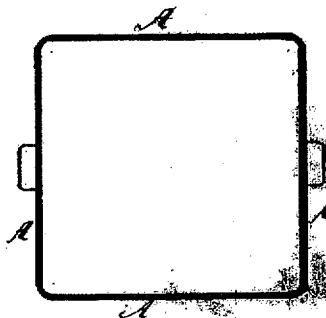

DESIGN FOR ASH-BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,435**, dated August 8, 1876; application filed July 3, 1876.

[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANDREW SCHMITT, of Williamsburg, Kings county, State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern and Form of Boxes used for Ashes, Garbage, &c., of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

Figure I is a side view of my improved ash-box. Fig. II is a top view of the same.

A represents the body or material of which the boxes are made. They are made square

with rounded-off corners, and the strips of metal B B are put around the boxes at the top and bottom and in the center. Other strips C C are fastened to the sides vertically, crossing the strips B B.

I do not confine myself to the number of the strips B B and C C, as increased sizes of boxes will require increased number of strips.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a square ash-box, with rounded-off corners, and provided with strips B B and C C, substantially as described.
