DESIGN FOR AN UMBRELLA.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,437, dated August 15, 1876; application filed July 25, 1876. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, GEORG BOCKSTALL-ER and JULIUS STEINER, of the city and county of St. Louis, and State of Missouri, have originated a new Design for Vehicle-Umbrellas, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

a represents the covering of the umbrella, which is supported on ribs b. These ribs are eight in number, and are so arranged as to form an irregular octagonal or eight-sided umbrella-top. Four of these sides are made wide, and four narrow, so as to give to the umbrella-top an irregular octagoval shape, indicated by the photographic illustration hereunto annexed.

What we claim as our invention is-

The design for an umbrella-top having the irregular octagon form, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
