DESIGN FOR FLOWER-BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,444, dated August 15,1876; application filed April 22, 1876. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Rogers, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Flower-Box, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustrations, to which reference is made. It consists of an oblong box, with rounded corners in front, and with various designs in medallion form on it.

Directly in front is a group of four children, representing a plowing-team, with a branch

of a tree for a plow. On one side of this is a group of children making wreaths of leaves, and on the other two are cultivating and watering plants, and in panels on either side is a boy blowing bubbles and a girl feeding a parrot.

What I claim as my invention is—
A design for a flower-box, with medallions, substantially as described.
